4.2 Development Committee

The local CLD AGM was held on Friday, May 12, 2017 at Café sur Mer, 160, Principale. There are three administrator positions to be filled. A meeting of the Committee will be held on June 7 at the Leisure Centre. Welcome to those interested in being part of the CLD.

4.3 Leisure Committee

The next activity will be held on June 23, it is the traditional evening of St-Jean at the parking in front of the Catholic Church. Raising of the flag, bonfire, francophone music and bar service.

4.3 Library Committee

As part of the AGM of network/library held on Saturday, May 27, the director of the library of Métissur-Mer presented the activities of the year. Her very good quality document was appreciated and will be presented throughout the library network. In comparison, our library with its 595 subscribers with a rate of 98.7% and its 222 local cultural activities are the most effective. Another municipality with substantially the same number of citizens, has only 39.8% of subscribers and 2 local cultural activities. In addition, we received a special mention for the program: Book club TD 2016 offers to young people in both languages, has been chosen 8th across Canada.

4.4 Beautification Committee

Distribution of trees took place on May 27. It was a success, 600 trees given in 1 hour 30 minutes. About thirty peoples went to choose trees.

RESOLUTION #17-06-100 RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE BSL MILK PRODUCERS

- **CONSIDÉRANT** que le secteur laitier québécois est un moteur économique pour l'ensemble des régions du Québec, en générant quelque 82 000 emplois directs et indirects et 1,3 milliards de dollars en contribution fiscale; **CONSIDÉRANT** que, lors d'une conférence de presse tenue au Wisconsin le 18 avril dernier, le président américain, M. Donald Trump, a accusé le secteur laitier canadien de faire du tort aux producteurs américains qui vendaient du lait diafiltré au Canada, en prétextant que le Canada avait des pratiques commerciales déloyales avec la nouvelle classe d'ingrédients laitiers qui vient d'être mise en place; **CONSIDÉRANT** que le président américain, M. Donald Trump avait préalablement indiqué sa volonté de renégocier l'Accord de libre-échange nord-américain (ALÉNA); CONSIDÉRANT que l'ALÉNA exclut le secteur laitier canadien de toutes concessions de marché supplémentaire que celles prévues par l'Accord sur l'agriculture de l'Organisation mondiale du commerce (OMC); CONSIDÉRANT que, malgré cette exclusion, depuis l'entrée en vigueur de l'ALÉNA, les importations de produits laitiers des États-Unis au Canada sont passées de 24 000 tonnes, d'une valeur de 50 millions de dollars, à plus de 177 000 tonnes, valant plus d'un demi-milliard de dollars et représentant les trois quarts de l'ensemble des importations canadiennes de produits laitiers; **CONSIDÉRANT** que l'inclusion de la gestion de l'offre dans les négociations de l'ALÉNA ouvrirait la porte à de nouvelles concessions de marché et causerait des pertes de revenus et d'emplois, ce qui serait dommageable pour le secteur laitier mais aussi pour les collectivités rurales de partout au Québec et au Canada; CONSIDÉRANT que tous les pays ont des politiques agricoles et des secteurs sensibles à préserver dans le cadre de leurs relations commerciales; CONSIDÉRANT que la gestion de l'offre est un modèle agricole légitime qui permet aux producteurs de tirer un juste revenu du marché, sans subvention, tout en apportant des retombées positives pour l'ensemble de la société, tant au plan social et de la sécurité alimentaire qu'au plan économique;
- **CONSIDÉRANT** que la gestion de l'offre assure aux consommateurs un panier de produits laitiers de grande qualité à un prix qui se compare avantageusement à celui payé ailleurs dans le monde;
- **CONSIDÉRANT** que, tant le gouvernement du Québec que celui du Canada ont, à de multiples occasions, au cours des dernières années, réitéré leur appui à la gestion de l'offre;

It is proposed by Councillor Ms. Martine Bouchard and resolved unanimously that the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer accepts the filing of the certificate for registration of qualified voters from Director General certifying:

RESOLUTION #17-06-103 REQUEST FOR ADOPTION OF THE BILL 122 BEFORE THE MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS 2017

CONSIDERING THAT the deposit of Bill No. 122 fits into the will of the Government of Quebec to transform in depth its relationship with the municipal sector recognizing local municipalities and MRCs as true proximity Governments;

CONSIDERING THAT with Bill No. 122, the Government should open a new era of collaboration between two real levels of Government;

CONSIDERING THAT to give more autonomy and more powers to local municipalities and MRCs of Quebec will be decisive for the future not only of the municipal sector, but also for the future of the regions of Quebec;

CONSIDERING THAT Bill No. 122 is part of many claims of the FQM for over 30 years;

CONSIDERING THAT the FQM is generally satisfied with the content of Bill No. 122, even if some amendments could be made in order to improve the scope;

CONSIDERING THAT the municipal elections will be held on Sunday, November 5, 2017;

FOR THESE REASONS,

It is proposed by Councillor Ms. Rita D. Turriff and resolved unanimously that the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer:

DEMANDS to members of the *Commission de l'aménagement du territoire de l'Assemblée nationale du Québec* to accelerate the detailed review of the Bill No. 122.

DEMANDS as a result of the detailed review, members of *l'Assemblée nationale du Québec* quickly adopt Bill No. 122 so that it will take force before the municipal elections on Sunday, November 5, 2017.

WHEREAS the Town of Métis-sur-Mer receives several requests for the installation of public lighting;

WHEREAS the Town favours the installation of public lighting at the intersections of streets where there is a problem;

FOR THESE REASONS,

It is proposed by Councillor Mr. Normand Provost and resolved unanimously that the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer allows installation on an existing electrical pole of a street light at the corner of 2nd range and rue Plourde and allows the installation of a new electrical pole and a street light at the corner of route 132 and route MacNider (Southeast).
