6.3 Jurisdiction of the MRC with respect to public transportation.

RESOLUTION #23-03-42

PUBLIC TRANSIT: JURISDICTION TO THE MRC OF MITIS

CONSIDERING the receipt, by registered mail, of resolution number C.M. 23-02-008 of the Regional County Municipality (RCM) of La Mitis dated February 21, 2023 declaring its intention to declare jurisdiction in accordance with section 678.0.2 of the *Municipal Code*

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 678.0.2.3 of the *Municipal Code*, the local municipality must, within 60 days of receiving the resolution from the regional county municipality, identify any official or employee who devotes his or her time to work and whose services will no longer be required because the municipality loses jurisdiction in this matter

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 678.0.2.3 of the *Municipal Code*, the local municipality must, within 60 days of receiving the resolution from the regional county municipality, identify any equipment or material that will become useless because the municipality is losing jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, **pursuant to** section 678.0.2.9 of the *Municipal Code*, a local municipality over which the regional county municipality has declared its jurisdiction under section 678.0.2.1 may not exercise the right of withdrawal granted by the third paragraph of section 188 of the *Act respecting land use planning and development*

IT IS THEREFORE PROPOSED by Councillor Carmen Migneault and unanimously resolved :

- > **TO ACCEPT** that the Regional County Municipality of La Mitis adopt a by-law in accordance with Section 678.0.2.1 of the *Municipal Code*, declaring its jurisdiction over the local municipalities in its territory with respect to public transit;
- > **CONFIRM** that no officer or employee is affected by the loss of jurisdiction over public transportation pursuant to Section 678.0.2.3 of the *Municipal Code*;
- > **TO CONFIRM** that no equipment or materials will be rendered useless as a result of this loss of jurisdiction pursuant to Section 678.0.2.3 of the *Municipal Code*;
- > **TO SEND** a confirmed copy of this resolution to the MRC de La Mitis in accordance with article 678.0.2.3 of the Municipal Code

RESOLUTION #23-03-43 LIST OF PROPERTIES TO BE SOLD FOR NON-PAYMENT OF TAXES

CONSIDERING that the Municipality must collect all municipal taxes on its territory;

GIVEN that it is in the interest of the Municipality to transmit to the MRC de La Mitis office, the list of properties for which debtors are in default of paying municipal taxes, so that these properties may be sold in accordance with articles 1022 and following of the *Municipal Code*.

THEREFORE, it is proposed by Councillor Simon Brochu and unanimously resolved:

THAT the Director General and Secretary-Treasurer, transmit, before March 31, to the office of the MRC de La Mitis, the attached list of immovables, to proceed with the sale of said immovables by public auction, in accordance with Articles 1022 and following of the *Municipal Code*, to satisfy the unpaid municipal taxes, with interest and costs incurred, unless these taxes, interest and costs are paid before the sale

THAT the Director General and Secretary-Treasurer be designated as the Municipality's representative to acquire, if necessary, the properties to be sold for non-payment of taxes. If he is unable to attend, his assistant will replace him on that day;

WHEREAS the list of immovables below includes immovables for which 2022 municipal taxes and previous years are not paid on December 31, 2022 plus interest on March 31, 2023 totaling a balance greater than \$500;

6.5 Rejection of the proposal to redraw the boundaries of federal electoral districts in Eastern Quebec.

RESOLUTION #23-03-44

REJECTION OF THE PROPOSAL TO REDRAW THE FEDERAL ELECTORAL BOUNDARIES IN EASTERN QUEBEC

Whereas, on July 29, 2022, the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Quebec presented a first redistribution proposal;

Whereas this proposal would reduce Eastern Quebec from four to three electoral divisions, by eliminating the one of Avignon-La Mitis-Matane-Matapédia and by distributing it in the bordering divisions:

^{er}Whereas, on February 1, 2023, the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission for Quebec reiterated this redistribution proposal following public consultations that were largely unfavourable to this option

Considering that this redistribution proposal is inadmissible for the City of Métis-sur-Mer, since it would diminish the representation of a rural, sparsely populated region, and the effective representation of its population, as demonstrated in the numerous briefs submitted by the elected officials of the Bas-Saint-Laurent and Gaspésie regions to the Commission

FOR THESE REASONS, it is proposed by Councillor Raynald Banville and unanimously resolved by the members present

That the Council of the City of Métis-sur-Mer is opposed to the proposed redistribution.

To ask for the maintenance of the current federal electoral districts in Eastern Quebec.

7. PUBLIC WORKS

7.1 Application for assistance under the Local Roads Assistance Program.

RESOLUTION #23-03-45

APPLICATION FOR ASSISTANCE UNDER THE LOCAL ROADS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

It is proposed by Councillor Christopher Astle and unanimously resolved to present a request for financial assistance to the Ministry of Transport within the framework of the Local Road Aid Program, Component Specific Improvement Program, sub-component electoral district (PPA-CE), for the rehabilitation of a portion of Plourde Street, between 2e rang Est and the railway, by applying a triple surface treatment with a "Fog seal". The estimated cost of the work is \$30,000.

TO MANDATE AN ENGINEERING SERVICE FOR THE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE PAVING OF MACNIDER ROAD, FROM 4^E RANG EST TO THE NORTH

It is proposed by Councillor Raynald Banville and unanimously resolved that the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer give a mandate to Aqua Ingenium to prepare the plans and specifications for the paving of MacNider road, from 4e rang Est towards the North, for a maximum of \$200,000.

NOTICE OF MOTION given by Councillor Christopher Astle that at a subsequent meeting of this council, it will be proposed to adopt a by-law concerning the demolition of buildings number 23-165. A draft by-law is tabled and adopted at this meeting.

8.2 Deposit and adoption of draft by-law #23-165 regarding the demolition of buildings on the territory of Métis-sur-Mer

RESOLUTION #23-03-49

TABLING AND ADOPTION OF DRAFT BY-LAW NUMBER 23-165 CONCERNING THE DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS

WHEREAS the Town of Métis-sur-Mer is governed by the Cities and Towns Act of Quebec and is subject to the provisions of the Land Use Planning and Development Act (R.S.Q., Chapter A-19.1)

WHEREAS section 148.0.2 of the Act respecting land use planning and development (R.S.Q., chapter A-19.1) stipulates that every municipality is required to maintain a by-law relating to the demolition of buildings;

WHEREAS section 120 of the Cultural Heritage Act (R.S.Q., chapter P-9.002) stipulates that a regional county municipality must adopt and periodically update an inventory of buildings built before 1940 that are located on its territory and that have heritage value, and that it may also include buildings that were built more recently

WHEREAS the inventory carried out by the Regional County Municipality of La Mitis pursuant to Section 120 of the Cultural Heritage Act (R.S.Q., Chapter P-9.002) may include immovables located on the territory of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer

WHEREAS section 148.0.1 of the Act respecting land use planning and development (R.S.Q., chapter A-19.1) determines that a heritage immovable is an immovable cited in accordance with the Cultural Heritage Act (R.S.Q., chapter P-9.002), located in a heritage site cited in accordance with that Act or listed in an inventory referred to in the first paragraph of section 120 of that Act

WHEREAS section 138 of the Act to amend the Cultural Heritage Act and other legislative provisions (2021, chapter 10) provides that every municipality must, at least 90 days before issuing a permit or certificate of authorization for the demolition of an immovable built before 1940 notify the Minister of Culture and Communications of its intention to do so, together with any information or document required by the Minister, until the inventory provided for in the first paragraph of section 120 of the Cultural Heritage Act has been adopted in respect of its territory;

WHEREAS City Council is committed to ensuring and maintaining the sustainability of the municipal property value of buildings and the protection of heritage buildings within its boundaries;

WHEREAS a notice of motion of this by-law was given at the meeting held March 6, 2023.

FOR THESE REASONS, it is proposed by Councillor Carmen Migneault and unanimously resolved that the Council of the City of Métis-sur-Mer adopt the draft by-law concerning the demolition of buildings number 23-165.

9. FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

9.1 Mandate the City of Matane to proceed with a joint call for tenders for the purchase and renewal of self-contained breathing apparatus.

MANDATE THE CITY OF MATANE TO PROCEED WITH A JOINT CALL FOR TENDERS FOR THE PURCHASE AND RENEWAL OF SELF-CONTAINED BREATHING APPARATUS

WHEREAS the Town of Métis-sur-Mer must proceed with a call for tenders for the purchase and renewal of these self-contained breathing apparatus for its fire department

GIVEN THAT several municipalities of the MRC of La Matapédia, La Matanie and La Mitis must soon take similar steps for the purchase and renewal of their self-contained personal protective breathing apparatus for their fire department

GIVEN THAT several municipalities of the MRCs of La Matapédia, La Matanie and La Mitis have shown interest in joint calls for tenders for the purchase and renewal of their self-contained personal protective equipment for their fire departments

CONSIDERING THAT joint tendering can limit the cost of contracts;

WHEREAS the City of Matane has volunteered to proceed with a joint call for tenders for the purchase and renewal of self-contained personal protective breathing apparatus for the fire departments of the participating municipalities

FOR THESE REASONS, it is proposed by Councillor Christopher Astle and unanimously resolved that the Council of the Town of Métis-sur-Mer mandates the Town of Matane to proceed with a joint call for tenders for the purchase and renewal of self-contained breathing apparatus for the fire safety services of the participating municipalities, the associated management costs being shared equitably between the participating municipalities.

9.2 Hiring of a firefighter for the Métis-sur-Mer Fire Department
