

INFO-PRÉVENTION - Bulletin d'information en sécurité April 2019

Who does what?

The citizen is primarily responsible for his safety. In a disaster situation, he can be supported by his municipality, which in turn can rely on the support of government resources when the situation requires it.

Quebec's civil security system is based on a clear division of responsibilities between the various actors, which aims at the complementarity and coherence of civil security actions.

Responsibility of citizens

You are primarily responsible for your safety!

In an emergency or disaster situation, it is up to you to take the first steps that will be most decisive to ensure your own safety, that of your family and the safeguarding of your property.

What can you do?

Properly insure your assets;

Prepare your family emergency plan.

Have an emergency kit at home at all times that you can also bring with you in case of an evacuation to support the first 3 days of an emergency.

Inquire with your municipality or on the Internet about the risks of disasters in your community and what needs to be done to protect yourself.

Prepare your emergency kit

Having an emergency kit at home is important. In an emergency, it will allow you and your family to provide for your basic needs while waiting for help. If the situation requires evacuation from your home, you can bring it with you.

Your kit must contain enough items and supplies to survive for the first 72 hours of a disaster. For more information, please visit the Department of Public Safety's website at www.publicsafety.gouv.qc.ca or contact the RCM fire safety department in La Mitis

The Green Newsletter - « ... and what about a bottle of water deposit refund system? »

In the previous Green Newsletter, we discussed the problem of glass recycling and solutions with a deposit refund system (DRS) or with new technologies. However, there is also another disposable container that floods our landfill and unfortunately our environment: The 700 million of water plastic bottles sold in Quebec each year!

Established in 1984, the "Consigné Québec" initially targeted only aluminum, glass and plastic soft drink and beer containers in order to, successfully, increase their recovery rate. Already in 2005, the Quebec government was talking about a DRS on other types of single-use plastic bottles, similar to what is done in New Brunswick where a DRS for water plastic bottles have been in place since 1992 with a recovery rate of 76%. The project didn't happen.

As for wine bottles, the question arises: Since water bottles are only a fraction of the plastic in our blue bins, wouldn't it be better to continue to use the blue bin instead? According to the industry, this solution would be 7 times cheaper and more sustainable in greenhouse gas issued from transportation than the implementation of a deposit.

From 2015 to 2017, the recovery rate in the blue bin of non-refund plastic bottles (water, juice, etc.) was 70% which is a rate similar to the refundable plastic bottles. One way or another, too many bottles end up in the landfill where it will take more than 400 years to decompose.

A third way, more within our reach, is needed: **Reduce at the source**. Let's stop buying single-use water bottles. Let's use reusable bottles to drink the quality water from our faucets that is already being paid with our taxes. Let's make it accessible in our parks and in our sports and community centers, while banning the sale of disposable plastic bottles from these places. A Léger survey published earlier this year showed that 3 out of 5 Quebecers are ready to completely ban single-use water plastic bottles. Why pay to pollute when a simple, economical and effective solution already exists?
