

LIGHTHOUSE – MOVING FORWARD IN 2019



Late last fall, the Ville and the Association des résidents de la Pointe du Phare (ARPP) signed a 15-year lease for the management of the Pointe-Mitis lighthouse site. The ARPP immediately commissioned the necessary plans and specifications for the full renovation of the exterior of the lighthouse tower and applied to Parks Canada for funding for this work. Unfortunately, the application was not funded, but the ARPP was

strongly encouraged to resubmit the proposal next year. Regardless, the ARPP is proceeding this spring with urgent renovations of the keeper's house, which should be ready to welcome guests by the end of summer. The association is also working hard to open the site to the public on a daily basis. Plans will require visitors to park their vehicles at the head of Route du phare (near Route 132) before making the short walk to the lighthouse site (about a 15-minute stroll). To facilitate these visits, the ARPP is

is collaborating with the Ville and local property owners to develop a small parking area and information kiosk and hopes to have them completed by mid-summer. The ARPP will also continue hosting a number of public events at the lighthouse this summer including their annual community picnic and other activities in collaboration with community groups. One in particular is the Heritage Lower St. Lawrence's *Rotating the Lens*, which will involve a series of workshops to develop tile mosaic artwork for the site. Let's keep our seal population happy

We are now into the birthing season for seal pups, which is also the season when seal pups die needlessly, either victims of the kindness of people who want to "help" them or the recklessness of those hoping for a cool selfie. True, they are adorable! And sure, their cries are heartbreaking and we want to rescue them. We do have good intentions! But the fact is that in general, they are simply resting or patiently waiting for their mother to return to feed them, which she won't do if there are two-legged creatures around! She might even abandon the pup if she no longer recognizes its scent because of human contact, condemning him to certain death.

Even after their weaning, it is not uncommon to see them staying for hours on the shore. They're still just resting. They are oblivious and may even come towards you, calling out to you. They don't know it's dangerous. You do! You want to help? Keep your distance (at least 50 m) and keep your dog on a leash! If you see people approaching a seal pup, explain that they are putting that baby's life in danger. If you have family or friends visiting, let them know too! Remember that these are unpredictable wild animals that can be aggressive, bite and transmit disease.

For kayakers, if you approach rock formations and the adult seals seem more and more agitated around you, they're telling you that you are too close and that you are disturbing them! They are likely protecting their pups. Just paddle away and they will probably escort you a while, giving you a great opportunity to observe them.



Call Marine Mammal Emergency immediately at 1-877-722-5346: if you see an injured seal; if people are handling or disturbing a seal on shore; or if you find a dead seal beached ashore. If needed, trained volunteers can go on site to raise awareness. Unfortunately, Métis-sur-Mer is a known "hot spot" for cases of harassment involving seal pups, so let's spread the word and try to educate not only the people here, but also the many visitors who come to see us every summer. The seals thank you!

It's official: winter is (finally) over and it's spring-cleaning time! Do you have a large amount of material for disposal that may be too much (by volume or its nature) for regular pick-up? As usual, the Écocentre of La Mitis is your deposit point allowing you to get rid of this unwanted residue in a responsible and environmentally-respectful way. From April 23 until November, our opening hours are:

Monday to Friday: 8:00 a.m. to 4:45 p.m.

Saturday: 8:00 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.

Sunday: Closed

Materials that are accepted include:

Construction materials

Ferrous and non-ferrous metals (aluminum, iron, copper, etc.)

Bulky items (furniture, appliances, fridges, mattresses, etc.)

Computer, electronic and electrical components

Tires (48" and less) – fees may apply for tires of larger dimensions

Hazardous household waste (paint, batteries, used oil, etc.)

Yard waste (branches, leaves, etc.)

And more!

Before bringing your goods to the Écocentre, please **sort your materials** by type. Thoroughly **secure the materials** in your vehicle so that they do not fly away en route.

Your Écocentre provides its services for free if you are resident of La Mitis. Take advantage of it! It is located at 428 Roger-Marcoux Avenue. Access is via Perreault East Road, near the Mont-Joli airport.

"To be able to clean chimneys on the territory of the MRC Mitis, any chimney sweeper must have a licence of chimney-sweeping given by the Service. Moreover, the person who will do the inspections will have to be duly qualified. ». Extract of regulation # 03-13, Town of Métis-sur-Mer.

DUMP FOR BRANCHES AND DEAD LEAVES - Open from May 15, 2019

Notice to entrepreneurs and landscapers:

If you work on property outside the municipality of Métis-sur-Mer, you must not dispose of waste branches, dead leaves etc. in the Métis-sur-Mer dump. This dump is reserved strictly for the residents of Métis-sur-Mer. The dump for branches, dead leaves and earth is located just across from 249, Chemin de la Station (fire station). Please follow the signs along the road to ensure you reach the designated area. It is prohibited to dump garbage bags or construction wood.

BURNING BRANCHES, TREES OR DEBRIS: PERMISSION REQUIRED

Please ask permission several days in advance. Burning permit is free.
