





A kit to confort patients with cancer

Patients in eastern Quebec who are undergoing chemotherapy or immunotherapy will now receive a comfort kit to support them during their treatments.

The Eastern Quebec Cancer Association (ACEQ) kicked off this project to increase patient comfort during their treatment, which can last up to eight hours. Each item in the kit is intended to address a need that patients have articulated.

Practically speaking, people in chemotherapy often feel cold and thirsty or have a metallic taste in their mouth. There is something to tackle each of these discomforts in the kits, noted ACEQ CEO Nelson Charette.



This kit includes a blanket, a water bottle, a box of mints, a notebook of mandalas and a card of encouragement made by students from the region.

The Association estimates that about 2,000 patients in the Lower Saint Lawrence, Gaspé and North Shore regions and the Madeleine Islands will receive these kits in the first year of the project.

A patient initiative

The kits were the idea of Judy Martin, who had been given a kit by her older sister when she underwent bouts of chemotherapy in 2012.

"The blanket keeps you warm during treatment, not necessarily just physically, but also spiritually, because it means someone thought about you, who knows that treatment is difficult and simply wanted to make things a bit less uncomfortable for you," explained Ms. Martin.

Since then, Ms. Martin created The Bell Fund, which supplies the comfort kits to patients at Montreal's McGill University Health Centre.

Judy Martin describes herself as "very proud" to see such a project put in place in Eastern Quebec, because she had several of her treatments in Rimouski.

The first 3,000 kits prepared by the ACEQ were fully financed by a \$125,000 gift from the Molson Foundation.

They will be distributed by volunteers and nurses in 16 oncology clinics in the region.

A meeting that bore fruit

About two years ago, the Eastern Quebec Cancer Association (ACEQ) approached Heritage Lower Saint Lawrence to discuss how to improve awareness of ACEQ's services and to engage more actively with anglophones in the area. In light of Montrealer Judy Martin's "comfort kits" project, it was natural to start by

meeting with the directors of ACEQ and Ms. Martin. The meeting immediately bore fruit. Together, with the support of the Molson Foundation, they began offering the first kits to patients in Eastern Quebec. Soon, like many schools in the region, l'école l'Envol also participated in the project: its students made the 'get-well-soon' cards, which are included in each kit.

On Friday, November 9, in Rimouski, more than a dozen Métis-sur-mer residents, ages 10 to 80, got to work with 30 volunteers to assemble the first 500 kits.

Congratulations to our Metisites [or Metisians?) and everyone else who contributed to bringing support to people who receive a diagnosis of cancer in eastern Quebec.




MBS Inauguration

INFO-PRÉVENTION - Fire safety newsletter November 2018



Some tips to help you decorate your Christmas tree safely



Decorating the Christmas tree as a family is such a wonderful part of the holidays. Everyone's excited, especially the children. You have everything you need, from ornaments to garlands and lights. This year's will be the loveliest tree ever! You know that there are some fire safety considerations to keep in mind when trimming your tree, but you're not quite sure you know them all.

We're here to help! The Service de sécurité incendie is happy to give you some Christmas tree safety tips.

- First of all, set up your tree far away from any heat sources.
- Before stringing the lights, make sure they are certified by the Canadian Standards Association (CSA), that they are not damaged or cracked, and that they are intended for indoor use.
- If you have a natural tree, it is important to keep it well watered so that it doesn't dry out.
- Remember to turn off the lights every night before you go to bed.
- A working smoke alarm on the same floor as the tree also adds to your safety in any case, current by-laws require it.

Every year at Christmas time, apart from gifts and cakes, you pay to dispose of tons of recyclable, reusable and recoverable waste in the landfill!

So many materials that, once buried, will have long-term impacts on the environment, for you and for future generations. This year, be eco-friendly in your holiday season. Here are some tips:

A green Christmas tree:

Choose reusable decorations to over single use. It will cost you less in the long run. Use LED bulbs, which are more energy efficient and more durable.

Turn off your lights when you go to bed.
